"SOME HAVE GREATNESS THRUST UPON THEM" SHAKESPEARE'S TWELFTH NIGHT ARRIVES IN 1942, SANTA MONICA ON JULY 29

(Santa Monica) On July 29, 2016, The Shakespeare Center of Los Angeles' professional company will captivate audiences again after a successful 30 years of award-winning Shakespearean performances with the comedy, Twelfth Night. Hosted at Santa Monica College, the production runs through August 21, 2016 and is directed by one-time Royal Shakespeare Company member, Kenn Sabberton. With inspiration drawn from the real life events of the "Great Los Angeles Air Raid of 1942" and alien-invasion histeria, Twelfth Night is subtly immersed in the sights and sounds of the 1940's, along with original music by composer and cast member Fred Sanders (Feste).

In this irresistible romantic comedy, Sabberton will transport audiences to 1940s Los Angeles, in an other dimension where everything is turned upside down and nothing is what it seems. Viola loves Orsino, who thinks he loves Olivia. Olivia thinks she loves Cesario who is really Viola, dressed as a man. Malvolio thinks he is a gentleman, but he is not. The foolish and foppish Sir Andrew thinks he is a fine match for the Lady Olivia, but he is far from it. And Sebastian is actually played by a woman! There is disguise and impersonation at every turn; even the language is turned upside down. Nobody really knows who they are or what they want. A case of bodysnatchers at its finest!

Director Kenn Sabberton has been an actor, director and teacher for over thirty years. Prior to training he was the youngest ever Artistic Director of the Enfield Youth Theatre and was invited to work with the renowned National Youth Theatre. He trained at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama in London and achieved a B.A. degree in Theatre Studies and after many years working in London, Kenn was invited to join the Royal Shakespeare Company in Stratford Upon Avon and this lasted 10 years. Post the RSC, he has worked with London's Royal National Theatre, the Aquila Theatre Company and as an associate artist teacher with NYU Center for Ancient Studies, studying, lecturing and researching Shakespeare. This will be Kenn's fourth production with SCLA (previous shows include; As You Like It, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Romeo and Juliet). His notable film/ TV credits include Adrian Noble's "A Midsummer Nights Dream," "The Bill" and "The Lost World".

Summary: In 1942, bright lights in the skies of L.A. could only mean one of two things -- a Pearl Harbor-style attack by Japan or an alien invasion. The Great Los Angeles Air Raid, as it's become known, provides the perfect SoCal backdrop for the Shakespeare Center's new production of *Twelfth Night*. The gender-bending comedy -- which tracks the misadventures of shipwrecked twins Viola and Sebastian -- is famously filled with unrequited love, mistaken identity, love triangles, lies and some of the Bard's wittiest wordplay, which makes the hysteria-based setting an intriguing one. Directed by former Royal Shakespeare Company member Kenn Sabberton and performed by some of today's top recognized film and television actors, the show is set to take the stage at Santa Monica College.
